#### **2024 Property Tax Deadline**

The payment deadline for 2024 Taxes is December 31, 2024

To avoid a 10% interest penalty on 2024 taxes, *please ensure your online payments are processed early*.

A reminder that any online payments typically require *three to five business days* to be processed.

E-transfers are automatic deposit and are almost immediate. However paying through Affinity Tax bill payments method may take up to 5 business days.

## **Muenster Post Office Closure**

We have been notified that as of March 2025, the contract will be terminated between Eastside Liquidation and Canada Post.

In order to continue with postal service in Muenster a new retail location is required.

# **How Canada Post Selects Retailers:**

Retail postal offices may be opened based on customers' needs. Some of the deciding factors considered by Canada Post are:

- Retail store location and hours
- Accessibility
- Local management and network requirements.

#### **REACT News**

At the Nov 19/2024 regular meeting of the Village of Muenster, council resolved to switch to curbside bin pickup for garbage collection services within Muenster.

April 1, 2025 is the planned date to implement the new curbside garbage bin system.

#### **Details:**

- The curbside bin system will be mandatory for each residential tax title property within Muenster. Commercial properties will have the *option* of adopting the bin system
- Muenster will no longer receive weekly pickup as we do with the "tag-a-bag". Bin garbage pickup will be on a bi-weekly basis (bins are tipped every 2 weeks)
- The monthly fee to residents will be approximately \$13.60/month.
  This charge may change based on React's monthly fuel surcharge.
- This fee will be included on your April 1, 2025 utility bill and each monthly bill thereafter.
- Each cart holds 4 6 large bags depending on how full the bags are. We ask that garbage is bagged so litter does not blow around
- As part of the Automated Curbisde Service, REACT will provide a brochure that will be handed out with each cart delivered so you know how to use the cart, what can go in the cart, and how to place the cart on the street
- Each household will receive a cart with their address marked on it. The cart stays with that residence; if the house is sold or a new tenant moves in, the cart remains for the new resident's use.
- Snowbirds, people who head south for winter, keep their cart and continue to be charged monthly. It is not feasible for REACT to move carts back and forth for people on holidays.
- REACT retains ownership of the carts. Each cart has a value of \$100.00. REACT keeps track

of the carts with serial numbers to help prevent them from going missing. The homeowner is responsible for taking care of the cart, should one become damaged, lost or stolen. This \$100.00 charge would be the responsibility of the resident.

- If REACT causes damage to the cart while tipping it, they will replace the bin at no charge.
- If a household would like more than one cart, an additional monthly fee would be required.
- Carts will be delivered by REACT. The Village is not responsible for, or involved in, the cart placement or removal; REACT takes care of all the planning and execution of getting the Automated Curbside Service up and running.


### **Push Snow onto Yards**

When pushing snow after a large snowfall, these practices can help minimize money spent on municipal snow clearing:

- ❖ Push snow from your driveways well back into your yard. Ensure it is far enough back so as not to add to or impede the efforts of the grader.
- ❖ With large quantities of heavy snow, the space to pile snow in residential areas will ultimately run out. Pushing snow back onto yards as far as possible from the street is required.
- ❖ If snow is not pushed back far enough onto yards, the Village will be unable to avoid costs associated with hauling snow away.
- ❖ Graders are powerful machines, but not powerful enough to push through large piles that have set up "hard as a rock". When the grader has to make more passes as the winter proceeds, it can only push it so far off the street before it runs into the hard banks created from the last snow

removal The new snow becomes impossible to wing off any further and room runs out.

## **Driveway Plowing Policies**



❖ As residents, if we can push our driveway snow well back onto our yards, rather than pile it high beside the road, we can contribute to minimizing any future hauling costs throughout this long winter. Space is at a premium when we see large amounts of snow falling in short periods of time!

# Spring will come again!

❖ Any large quantities of snow left in our yards in the spring can be pushed out and spread out to allow it to melt. The issue of snow melt causing water concerns in homes may be avoided by spring diligence in breaking the large piles up at the warmer time of the year and allowing melting and drainage to work. This can be viewed as a cost savings method of dealing with excessive snow accumultion.

# **Snow Removal Policy**

Please refrain from parking vehicles on streets during/after snowfalls. The grader will do a much better job if they can pass free of obstacles.

A snow removal map is attached and will identify priority streets and removal responsibility.

\*The Village has plans to try alternative equipment to increase removal efforts in the residential sections/bays where the grader can not turn around easily.
